Description

At the event in Haninge two topics were discussed.

1. Types of Racism, Assessment of Racism and Discrimination. Comparison of Legislation of Partner Countries.

By the concept of racism, we mean the ideology that advocates the natural inequality of people, i.e. their distinction into superior and inferior people based on their biological or social characteristics. More specifically, racist theory asserts that inequality is indeed immutable and absolute. Racism is everywhere. We all see on a daily basis case of racism against foreigners, non-religionists, people with disabilities, women.

Racism is generally considered to be more than racial prejudice. Today, the word racism is used to describe the actions of one group of people against another group. This is how racists support racial diversity. Also, racial racists consider a certain homogeneous group of people as superior, e.g. they consider "white" people superior to "black" people. Forms: 1. Racial 2. Religious 3. Nationalism 4. Social 5. Sexism.

2. Hate speech in online environments is a special category that needs to be dealt with separately. The internet is the easiest communication tool that people use to insult their fellow man. It is extremely common to read derogatory comments online. People use websites, blogs and especially social networks for such practices. While browsing the internet, one can discover pages targeting nationality, nation, sexual orientation, religion, occupation, gender, physical appearance, economic status, social status, citizenship, etc. Reasons: 1) The lack of essential but mainly humanistic education allows the hetero determination of groups by the astute and the cultivation of fanaticism and racism at the expense of others. 2) Low self-esteem of individuals or groups leads people to upgrade their own special characteristics and to degrade other people. 3) The economic exploitation of man by man is moralized by the devaluation of the exploited. 4) Prejudices, since some people judge before meeting other people, for example, lifestyles, places of residence, social positions or jobs. 5) The worry, fear and anger caused by society.

Consequences 1) Financial: exploitation of the weak by the strong. 2) Social: the competitive spirit is cultivated and social problems appear.
